ALP Contest Expectations of Winners (Mr Atlanta Eagle, Ms Atlanta Eagle, MX Atlanta Eagle, Atlanta Eagle Rubber)

This following is an outline of the expectations of the Titleholders after winning their respective title as part of Atlanta Leather Pride (ALP). This is not intended to be all encompassing and can be amended as required by the producers of ALP-SEBB Events with notice of revision being provided to the Titleholders. Atlanta Leather Pride (ALP) is centered and focused around the Atlanta Eagle, and the primary focus of the Titleholders should be on the Atlanta Leather/Fetish/Kink community and the Atlanta Eagle as a whole.

- We expect you to exercise social intelligence in recognition of the visibility a
 Titleholder has. We expect you to respect the title you have; you are a
 figurehead and a representative. You will be seen as an extension of the Atlanta
 Eagle, Atlanta Leather Pride / ALP-SEBB Events, the community, and your
 peers.
- We understand that everyone has opinions about topics and we respect that
 individuality. These opinions may not always be in agreement with that of
 ALP-SEBB Events, the Atlanta Eagle or its owner, or your peers. When
 differences arise, keep decorum in mind with regards to your title. If there are
 questions pertaining to what may be appropriate please contact the ALP-SEBB
 production team in advance and we will assist.
- We expect you to approach your title responsibilities in the same way you would those of your daily job. If conflict or disagreement arises, discuss/resolve away from the public eye. with a moderator if needed. Do not be confrontational in a public environment.
- Don't be a Dick! Don't belittle others or other sub-communities. Don't show your ass. Remember you are a representative of the community. If you are having an off day or run out of spoons, politely bow out of what you are engaged in and take care of your wellbeing.
- Our primary goal for our Titleholders is for them to be a positive and effective representative of the title within the Atlanta community.
- Titleholders are asked to be visible throughout their title year and beyond and to represent the Atlanta Eagle and ALP at Atlanta Eagle/ALP based events whenever possible.
- Monthly ALP Titleholders barnight ALP Titleholders have a dedicated barnight at the Atlanta Eagle on the 3rd Friday of each month.
 - This monthly barnight can be used for fundraising opportunities (i.e. selling Jell-O shooters, raffles, auctions, etc.) Titleholders will need to work with the ALP-SEBB production team to receive approval from Atlanta Eagle on any event plans.
 - Proceeds may be used for titleholder travel funds (individual titleholder or split between all titleholders) or for charitable donations and must be disclosed prior to the event.

- It is expected that the titleholders work together as a team to plan and execute the Titleholders barnights. If a specific Titleholder barnight is to focus on an individual Titleholder, the other titleholders are still expected to participate in the planning and execution of the event.
- It is expected that titleholders work with the ALP-SEBB production team to develop marketing/advertisement materials and discuss event plans.
- If you will be unavailable to attend then please notify the ALP-SEBB production team in advance.
- During the title year (defined as the time between winning the title and stepping aside) it is expected that each Titleholder will coordinate and host a minimum of three fundraising events (events will need approval from the ALP-SEBB production team):
 - Fundraising event to benefit current Titleholder's travel fund
 - o Fundraising event to benefit a charity of Titleholder's choosing
 - Fundraising event to benefit the travel fund of the following year's Titleholder.
- Titleholders are expected to serve alongside your title family as a team; plan and execute as a unit when and where possible. Support and encourage each other by:
 - Cross-promoting each other's events
 - Attending each other's events
 - Be a proactive advocate and supporter of other members of your title family.
- Titleholders are not required to host all of their events at the Atlanta Eagle but where appropriate, should host their events at the Atlanta Eagle.
- Titleholders are expected to attend key SEBB Events including Southeast Black and Blue Weekend, Leather and Lace, and Atlanta Leather Pride.
 - If you are unavailable to attend these events for any reason, please notify the ALP-SEBB production team in advance.
- While we want your focus to be in Atlanta and the Southeast, if our Titleholder decides to proceed further to either IML, IMsL, ABW, MIR, or other applicable feeder contests then we will help them prepare for their contest in such was as:
 - Make introductions to other titleholders and producers
 - Provide coaching for competing in other contests
 - Suggesting fundraising ideas
 - o Providing guidance on conducting yourself as a Titleholder abroad
- Should you decide to compete at a higher level competition please notify the ALP-SEBB production team as soon as possible to discuss options available to you. Our preference for someone competing at a higher level is for it to occur in the second half of your title year or beyond. However, we can evaluate these dates on an as needed basis.
 - If the competition you intend to compete at requires any form of registration fees, those fees can be paid for out of your portion of the Titleholder's travel fund.
